PENN'S NINE DEFEATED.

For the Second Time This Season Harvard Won from the Philadelphians.

CAMBRIDGE, June 9.—Harvard defeated the University of Pennsylvania in the last baseball game of the series to-day by the score of 6 to 1. Harvard won the first game at Philadelphia May 21 by the score of 9 to 5. The Quakers were weak at the bat, but succeeded in getting one run on scratch hits. The Harvard team played very good ball, one careless error being their only fault.

Harvard's new batting order was very successful, for the hits were well bunched, especially with men on bases. Loughlin led at the bat for Harvard, with two hits, both of which brought in runs. Harvard's base running, in connection with the timely hitting, showed great improvement. Stillman pitched a steady game for Harvard and trusted more to his fielders than usual, striking out but two men. He received excellent support.

For Pennsylvania Orbin played a fast game at short stop. His only error in ten chances was excusable.

Pennsylvania started off with a rush in the first inning. Collier made a hit, was sacrificed to second, and scored on Jones's out. After this no Pennsylvanian passed second.
