

BROWN DOWNED PENN.

Red and Blue Hockey Team Badly Beaten in Championship Contest.

PHILADELPHIA, Penn., Jan. 18.—Brown University gave the University of Pennsylvania an admirable lesson in hockey here to-night at the Ice Palace by winning the first intercollegiate match by the score of 7 goals to 0. While the forwards and W. Gardiner, at point, showed some improvement over previous exhibitions, the team as a whole is decidedly weak, and has apparently not given much thought to the rudiments of the game.

The visitors gave a good, fast exhibition of hockey. At times Low and Pain appeared to the spectators as playing a decidedly rough game. But when the crowd stopped to consider how slow and lethargic was the work of the Red and Blue, it is not to be wondered at that the latter were bowled over frequently by trying to cross check a flying skater, and Low and Pain's apparent rough work was simply sharp, aggressive play, rendered more so by contrast. Brown scored 3 goals in the first half and 4 in the second, which was cut short by the timekeepers in order to allow other skaters on the ice. Line-up:
