

# PENNSY SCORES FEW POINTS.

## West Point's Accurate Shooting Brings Basket Ball Victory.

WEST POINT, N. Y., Feb. 5.—West Point outclassed the University of Pennsylvania basket ball team here to-day, and defeated the Quakers by a score of 29 to 8. With fairly good teamwork and covering their men the way they did, the visitors should have made a better showing, but Penn's inability to shoot and the Army's deadly accuracy in shooting goals told the story.

The cadets led by five goals before Marks shot Penn's first basket, and, with the Army steadily increasing its lead, the first half ended with the score Army, 19; Pennsylvania, 7.

In the last half the visitors had many chances to score, but were unable to make more than one point, which Marks made from the foul line. Conard sprained his ankle in the last half, but up to that time had shot six of the Army goals. The line-up:
