

# PENN WINS SEVEN BOUTS.

## Columbia No Match for Quakers in Wrestling Tournament.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 12.—The University of Pennsylvania wrestling team made a clean sweep in the meet with the men from Columbia University to-night, the Quakers winning every one of the seven bouts in as many classes. In a sense the victory was a surprise even to the followers of Penn, for the team up to to-night had had a very poor season of it.

The men wrestled under catch-as-catch-can rules, the time limit of each bout being nine minutes. The hardest contest of all was that in the 125-pound class, between Glaspy of Penn. and Robinson of Columbia, which required practically three bouts to determine the victor. The summaries:

115-Pound Class.—Dickson, Pennsylvania, won from Norton, Columbia, with a crotch hold in 1 minute 4 seconds.

125-Pound Class.—Glaspy, Pennsylvania, won from Robinson, Columbia, on the third trial with a chancery and barlock hold in the total time of 18 minutes 45 seconds.

135-Pound Class.—Stewart, Pennsylvania, threw Moierstein, Columbia, with a barlock hold in 3 minutes 28 seconds.

145-Pound Class.—Chapa, Pennsylvania, won from Ferrara, Columbia, in 2 minutes 52 seconds with a half Nelson and body hold.

158-Pound Class.—Howard, Pennsylvania, threw Berliner, Columbia, with a half Nelson and wrist hold in 8 minutes 48 seconds.

175-Pound Class.—Graham, Pennsylvania, threw Strasburger, Columbia, with a half Nelson in 9 seconds.

Heavyweight Class.—Pike, Pennsylvania, won from Catracouzinos, Columbia, with a head and barlock hold in 33 seconds.
