

COLUMBIA IS CHAMPION.

New Yorkers Again Win Intercollegiate Basket Ball Honors.

PHILADELPHIA, Penn., March 2.—Columbia University won the intercollegiate basket ball championship here to-night by defeating the University of Pennsylvania by the score of 22 to 20. The game was close and exciting throughout.

Capt. Benson of the Columbia team won the championship in the extra session of play, when he took a chance on a long shot and got the necessary points to win. The line-up:
