

TIGERS DOWN PENN.

Princeton Wins Five of Seven Bouts in Wrestling Series.

PRINCETON, March 6.—Princeton defeated Pennsylvania in the dual wrestling tournament here to-night by the score of 17 to 14. Seven bouts were contested, and the Tigers lost only two, winning one fall, two decisions, and getting two draws. The feature of the tournament was the work of Borivas of Pennsylvania, who slipped out of a dangerous hold and threw Longstreth of Princeton in 52 seconds. The summaries:

125-Pound Class.—Borivas, Princeton, threw Wooley, Pennsylvania, with half-Nelson and body hold. Time—8:00.

135-Pound Class.—Linsey, Pennsylvania, drew with Hancock, Princeton, in 12:00.

145-Pound Class.—Taswell, Pennsylvania, threw Srantz, Princeton, with half-Nelson. Time—2:23.

158-Pound Class.—France, Princeton, defeated Holmes, Pennsylvania, in 9:00. Referee's decision.

175-Pound Class.—Gile, Princeton, drew with Hogg, Pennsylvania, in 12:00.

Unlimited Heavyweight Class.—Borivas, Pennsylvania, defeated Longstreth, Princeton, with half-Nelson. Time—0:52.
