

CORNELL'S WRESTLING TITLE

Ithacans Capture It Third Time—
Dorizas Individual Star.

PHILADELPHIA, March 28.—Cornell for the third successive year to-day won the championship of the Intercollegiate Wrestling Association, scoring 24 points. Pennsylvania took second place with 17 points; Lehigh was third, with 12, Princeton scored 7, and Columbia 4.

The Ithaca wrestlers won first place in the 115, 125, 135, 145, and 158 pound classes, and secured third place in the heavyweigh' division.

Dorizas, the University of Pennsylvania champion strong man, won the heavyweight championship by throwing Good of Lehigh in 0:40 with a body hold. The only other fall registered in the final bouts was won by Boak, Cornell, who threw Martin, Lehigh, with a wrist roll and grapevine in 2:18 in the 125-pound class.

The other events were closely contested and required extra periods before the referees gave their decisions. The 175-pound event, won by Pendleton of Columbia from Bailey of Lehigh, resulted in some of the best wrestling from the viewpoint of the experts. The summaries:
