

PENN WRESTLERS HURT.

Tazewell Sustains Concussion of the Brain—Milligan Dislocates Elbow.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 19.—Pennsylvania's wrestling team was defeated by Lehigh tonight 21 to 2. Dorizas, the heavyweight champion, failed to appear against Pons, Lehigh's 260-pound entry, and his place was taken by Sykes Tucker. Tazewell and Milligan, Pennsylvania's entries in the 145 and 158 pound classes, were injured during their bouts, Tazewell sustaining a concussion of the brain and Milligan a dislocated elbow.

FRESHMEN KEEN FOR ROWING

Fordham Youngsters Turn Out a Squad of 80 for Crew.

A new scheme was introduced yesterday into the rowing game, which is being adopted at Fordham this Spring, when Coach John J. Mulcahy called together the freshmen candidates and formed them into a separate squad. Although the upper classmen have shown a mild interest, it is the first year men who have supplied most of the enthusiasm and candidates. For this reason Mr. Mulcahy announced that he intended to specialize during the coming season on the formation of a freshmen crew.

Eighty prospective oarsmen reported yesterday for the "infant" squad, and showed more interest than any of the upper classmen, who have yet put in an appearance. As the freshmen squad equals in number the other three classes and has in its membership a good number of husky young athletes who are entirely in earnest at the new Maroon sport, the Bronx coach announced yesterday that he expected a representative boat from the freshmen.

In order to get men who have been trained properly as long as possible plans are now under way to get the Fordham "Prep" boys out for the annual high school regatta.
