PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 15.—By a determined rally in the waning minutes of the game, Pennsylvania's exponents of basket ball came from behind and worked their way into first place in the intercollegiate league standing by defeating Princeton in a hard battle by the score of 26 to 22 on the Weightman Hall floor tonight. When time was called at the end of the regular periods the teams stood in a deadlock at 21 points each, and an extra five-minute period was played, the Quakers forging ahead with a rush and holding the lead to the finish.
