

PENN WINS CLOSE GAME.

Columbia Defeated in Alumni Day
Basket Ball Game.

Pennsylvania's basket ball team smashed a cherished Columbia tradition last night by defeating the Blue and White on the annual Alumni Day by a 25-to-22 score. Since 1909 Columbia, playing the Philadelphians, has won successive victories.

The game was one of the most interesting and sensational in years on the Morningside court. At the end of the second half the score was tied, 20 to 20, after Columbia had shown wonderful form in this half and had overcome Penn's sizable lead.

In the first overtime period of five minutes Captain Dwyer for Columbia scored a foul goal soon after playing began, and in the last few seconds McNichol, Pennsylvania's Captain, evened the score for the second time with a foul basket.

A minute's rest was taken and playing began in the second overtime period of five minutes. But Columbia had weakened under the Pennsylvania attack. Jefford, centre for the Red and Blue, spoiled Columbia enthusiasm in the crowd of alumni spectators. With an overhead shot he caged a floor basket, giving the visitors a two point lead. Captain McNichol made the lead sure a half minute later by another field basket, and just before time was called Captain Dwyer tallied Columbia's last point with a foul goal. The line-up:
