

PENN HAS TO FIGHT FOR SOCCER CROWN

**Quakers' Strong Finish Defeats
Princeton, 3 to 2, and
Wins College Title.**

PHILADELPHIA, Penn., Dec. 16.—The Pennsylvania soccer team today won the intercollegiate championship by defeating Princeton 3 to 2 on Franklin Field. Preyer of Princeton scored two goals in the first half and played a wonderful game throughout. Spencer and Nassau both scored for Penn in the first half. Although the wind was against them, the Red and Blue men played a fighting game in the second half.

Though Princeton started the second half with the advantage of the wind, the Penn attack always carried the ball into Tiger territory. Mohr and Baron both had chances to tally, but delayed too long and their shots were blocked.

Nassau sent the Red and Blue into the lead with a beautiful goal. Cohn made a pretty save for Princeton when Baron shot, but Nassau met the ball as Cohn drove it from the net and sent it whistling for a score. Nassau missed in another attempt at goal after Montenegro had made a fine pass to him, but it was due to the poor condition of the field rather than the Penn player.
