

# PENN MAKES FAST FINISH.

Quintet Comes from Behind to Beat Cornell by 23 to 18.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 24.—The Pennsylvania basketball players came from behind with a roar and a rush in the second half here tonight and pushed Cornell further down into the gloom of the cellar by bagging an exciting game in Weightman Hall, 23 to 18. Seven points in the rear when the final period began, the Red and Blue, led in its lively attack by Captain Eddie McNichol, rained shots at the basket, edged up to, caught, and went ahead of the invaders from Ithaca, never to be headed in the scoring again.

To McNichol go the chief honors of the victory. His two fouls which slipped through the net without touching the rim at the beginning of the second half, and his three subsequent field goals, which were netted before another Penn. man scored, placed the Red and Blue one point behind Cornell and furnished the incentive for harder, better, and faster play.
