Pennsylvania and Lehigh tied for second with 15 points, Princeton was third with 4 points, and Columbia failed to score.

Captain Sager of Cornell, by winning every, one of his three bouts by falls and the intercollegiate championship for his weight, was the individual star of the meet. Post of Cornell sprung a surprise by defeating Captain Milligan of Pennsylvania by decision after twenty-one minutes. Servais of Pennsylvania is individual lightweight champion by his victory over Rofe of Cornell.

Kaiser of Pennsylvania won the 135pound class by defeating Repa of Lehigh by decision in twenty-one minutes.
Jones of Princeton, in the 125, and
Winn of Princeton, in the heavyweight
class, each made two points for the
Tigers. Wigsten, the Cornell champion,
in the 125-pound class, scored six points
by two falls and a first place, and Bard
scored five for Cornell in the heavyreight division after a hard tussle with weight division, after a hard tussle with Pons, the Lehigh giant.
