

QUAKERS CONQUER COLUMBIA QUINTET

Pennsylvania Wins Opening Intercollegiate League Fray
by 21 to 16.

PHILADELPHIA, Penn., Jan. 5.—In the opening game of the Intercollegiate Basket Ball League Pennsylvania defeated Columbia this evening on the Red and Blue team's court by the score of 21 to 16. The game was marked by the close guarding of both quintets, only one basket being scored during the first half of the game. This period ended with the score 5 to 0 in Penn's favor.

During the opening period, Lou Martin, the Captain, and only veteran on the Penn five, crashed into Farrell and suffered a broken collarbone. The Red and Blue star will be unable to play for the rest of the present season, according to the physicians.

Columbia was outclassed on the opening of the second half, when the Penn team, centring their offense on Sweeney, scored 8 points in succession. Columbia rallied, but could not overcome their opponents' lead. For Penn, Sweeney did the most of the scoring, making 15 points. He registered on nine out of fourteen free throws. The line-up:
