ITHACA, N. Y., Feb. 12.—By defeating Cornell by the score of 21 to 18 before a great crowd in the armory here tonight Penn increased its lead in the race for the Intercollegiate Basketball League championship. By disposing of Cornell, Penn remains the only undefeated team in the league, with four victories to its credit.

Cornell got away with a fine start, Tripp scoring two field goals before Peck dropped the first tally for Penn. The Quakers then manifested a superior team play, and close guarding gave them a lead of 13 to 8 at the end of the first half. Penn started the second period with a rush, running up the score to 21, which was too much for Cornell.
