

NAVY BEATS PENN ON MAT.

Annapolis Grapplers Take All the Events on Schedule.

ANNAPOLIS, Feb. 15.—Naval Academy wrestlers overwhelmed the grapplers from the University of Pennsylvania here this afternoon, taking every bout and making a score of 33 to 0. Five clean falls were gained, and the other two bouts went to the navy contestants on decisions. The local wrestlers used a greater variety of holds than last week, the half Nelson and chancery holds, in common with body holds, predominating.

Gates, in the 175-pound class, threw Pendleton with a punishing body scissors and double arm lock above his head. Gallery and Paxton, in the 115-pound and 135-pound classes, showed special skill and aggressiveness. Ashby, in the 158-pound class, was the only Pennsylvanian to do much forcing. He brought Lewis to the mat, but in his efforts to hold the navy lad he wore himself out and succumbed to a bar and body hold.

115-Pound Class.—Gallery, Naval Academy, threw Gerson, Pennsylvania, with a half Nelson and body hold in 4 minutes 43 seconds.

125-Pound Class.—Mayberry, Naval Academy, won decision over Rhoads, Pennsylvania, in 9 minutes.

135-Pound Class.—Swingert, Naval Academy, threw Ketterer, Pennsylvania, with chancery and body hold in 4 minutes 25 seconds.

145-Pound Class.—Paxton, Naval Academy, won decision from Douty, Pennsylvania, in 9 minutes.

158-Pound Class.—Lewis, Naval Academy, threw Ashby, Pennsylvania, with bar and body hold in 4 minutes 53 seconds.

175-Pound Class.—Gates, Naval Academy, threw Pendleton, Pennsylvania, with a body scissors and double arm lock in 4 minutes 51 seconds.

Heavyweight Class.—Wilkie, Naval Academy, threw Crause, Pennsylvania, with a chancery and body hold in 3 minutes 43 seconds.

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
