

TIE IN HOCKEY GAME.

Army and Penn End Overtime Game with Score 1-1.

WEST POINT, N. Y., Jan. 24.—The Army and University of Pennsylvania played through a long afternoon to a tie game at hockey here today. The final score, which came after two regular periods of 15 minutes each and two extra periods of 5 minutes each, read: Army, 1; Penn., 1.

The game was played in a driving snow storm on Stuart rink near the gym. It was necessary to shovel the snow between the halves before play could be resumed.

At the end of the extra periods, both captains agreed to go on to a dead game, that is, until one or the other scored or all hands "died." The Army lads made the proposition and Penn accepted the defv. However, the storm nipped this scheme in the bud within the next five minutes, for the puck was lost in the snow after every face off.
