

# FORDHAM DEFEATS PENN.

## Maroon Hockey Team Takes Measure of Quakers, 14 to 3.

Fordham University hockey players met the University of Pennsylvania team last night on the ice at the 181st Street Ice Palace and were not extended to defeat the Quakers by the score of 14 to 3.

The game was a speedy one from first to last, and the large number of penalties imposed upon the players of both sides indicates the hard-fought nature of the contest. The Fordham team is one of three Eastern teams that has not been defeated so far this year, the others being Boston College and Harvard, and the Bronx team will meet both of them next month in this city.

Fordham clearly outplayed Pennsylvania. Pringle proved to be the star of the Quaker sextet, while first honors on the local team were divided among McPherson, the Newmans and Stinson. Strong team play was the real feature of Fordham's performance, rather than individual star play.
