

COLUMBIA LOSES ON ICE.

Penn Hockey Team Whitewashes New Yorkers by 2 Goals to 0.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 2.—The Penn Hockey team put over the season's surprise by defeating Columbia in a hard-fought game at the Ice Palace tonight by 2 goals to 0.

Diall, the husky right wing on the Quaker team, accounted for both goals. It was his dash down the ice and through the secondary defense, after seven minutes of play in the first period, that made possible the first goal. It was this same Diall who made the second goal in the final fifteen seconds of the initial period. Jeffreys, at goal, showed great improvement in his game. He submitted to a wicked attack, but never allowed the disk to enter the net. Penn's defense was almost impassable.

It was noticeable that Columbia was much handicapped. The New York boys had their first workout on a big rink, and they seemed lost for the first two periods. They showed great improvement in the final period.
