

PENN WHITEWASHED BY TIGER ICE TEAM

Princeton Battles to 2-0 Victory in Rough Hockey Match at Philadelphia.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 25.—Princeton defeated the Pennsylvania hockey team at the Ice Palace tonight by 2 to 0 in the roughest game played here this year. For two periods the sextets battled on even terms. "Battled" is the correct word.

Pennsylvania lost her opportunity to win in the final period when Captain Pringle got loose with the puck and, with no one but the goal tender between him and a point, skated to within five yards of the goal. It looked like a sure goal, but he was overanxious and the disc sailed many feet wide of the mark. That was the turning point of the game, for a few moments later Cook shot the puck into Penn's net. Two minutes later Merritt on a pass from Haight shot the disc past Jeffreys for the second and final goal.
