

# SHEFFEY WEAKENS AND QUAKERS LOSE

After Being Held Scoreless  
Princeton Hits Penn Twirler  
for 6 to 4 Victory.

PRINCETON, N. J., May 3.—In the first big game played here this season the Princeton nine defeated the University of Pennsylvania this afternoon by the score of 6 to 4.

Jefferies took the mound for Princeton, and although he was somewhat wild at the beginning, he settled down after the third inning and pitched superb ball. Sheffey, who did the twirling for Pennsylvania, showed good form at first, but after the fifth inning was hit almost at will by the Tigers.

Penn started off in the first inning with two runs and in the third inning scored another. Jefferies hit his stride in the next frame and allowed only one Penn man to cross the plate during the remainder of the game.

In the fifth, Sheffey walked Jefferies, and MacPhee started the scoring for Princeton by driving a three-bagger to right field, bringing in Jefferies. Princeton netted two more runs this inning and tied the score. In the sixth Penn got its last run, but in the last half of the sixth MacPhee, with two men on bases, stepped to the plate and clouted a homer to deep right, the ball disappearing through a hole in the south stand fence. These were the last men to cross the plate for either nine.
