

LEAGUE OPENER TO PENN.

Yale Five Outclassed in 36 to 16 Victory in Philadelphia.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 14.—Captain Bill Graves's Penn five opened the Intercollegiate League season here tonight by completely outclassing the Yale quintet by a 36 to 16 count.

The Red and Blue team showed excellent floor work and the New Haven quintet was powerless to stop the offensive of Coach Eddie McNicholl's men. The Red and Blue got the range of the basket early, taking the lead at the start. The final outcome was never in doubt.

Penn made a total of 14 tallies from the floor, while Yale got only 4. The score at the end of half time was 18 to 9. Rosenast and Graves were the leading scorers for Penn.
