

# COLUMBIA BEATEN BY QUAKERS ON ICE

**New York Collegians Lose  
Hockey Game to Pennsylvania,  
5 to 4, in Extra Period.**

PHILADELPHIA, Jan 20.—Columbia University's hockey team went down to defeat at the hands of Pennsylvania in an extra-period game at the Ice Palace tonight by a score of 5 goals to 4.

With the score deadlocked at 4 goals each at the end of the third period, it was decided to play overtime until one team scored. In the extra period Captain Murray of Penn got past the Columbia defense and skimmed the puck into the net after 2 minutes and 25 seconds of exciting play.

Columbia started out strong, and led Penn by 3 to 2 at the end of the second period, due to the clever shooting of Anderson, but the New Yorkers appeared to tire after that, and Penn rallied.
