

# TIGERS AGAIN BEAT QUAKERS AT HOCKEY

Orange and Black Puck Chasers Register Second Victory of Season Over Penn Sextet.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 27.—The University of Pennsylvania hockey team suffered its second defeat this season at the hands of the Princeton team by the score of 2 to 0. This was Penn's first game under Caddy Winters, the new coach, and the Red and Blue played a much improved game over the previous clash with the Tigers, which the latter won, 4 to 0.

To Vangerbig and Jewett went the honors of scoring the only goals in the forty-five minutes of thrilling play. Van Gerbig, the New York lad, shot a long goal in the first period. After that Penn outplayed the Tigers, but was unable to get the puck by Captain Maxwell. Forty-nine seconds before the end of the game Jewett, in a scuffle right near the net, eluded a pack of Penn defensive men and scored the second and final goal.
