**Downs Penn Sextet on Ithaca Rink

ITHACA, N. Y., Feb. 11.—Cornell vanquished Pennsylvania here today at hockey by a score of 4 to 2. The game was fast but, on account of the poor ice, neither team could reach its best form.

Davidson, Cornell's right wing, made all four of the tallies credited to the Red sextet, two, unassisted, after rushes down the ice and two on passes from Finn. Cornell scored twice in the first and once in each of the second and third periods. Wanamaker of Penn scored twice for the Quakers in the third period on passes from O'Reilly.
