

PENN SWAMPS YALE FIVE.

League Leaders Gain Easy Victory Over Tailenders, 31 to 16.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., March 1.—In a battle between the intercollegiate basketball leaders and tail-enders tonight Penn easily defeated Yale by the score of 31 to 16. The Quakers shot away at a terrific clip, tallying 13 points before Yale broke into the scoring column, and, although Yale spurted once in each playing half the visitors had no trouble in maintaining their lead, closing the first half with a 20 to 7 margin. Although Yale scored 9 points in the second half to 11 for Penn, the Quakers were clearly playing cautiously, while Yale resorted to desperate long throws. Grave scored 15 of his team's points. Cooper and Kernan showed flashes of brilliancy for the losers. The Quakers used substitutes freely in the second half.
