PENN PLAYERS WIN OVER URSINUS NINE

Yadusky's Pitching Helps the Quakers Triumph in Opening Game by 3 to 2 Score.

PHILADELPHIA, April 4.—Uncanny fielding on the heavy turf and the strong right arm of Bill Yadusky gave Penn a 3 to 2 victory over Ursinus in the opening baseball game of the season for both teams on Franklin Field today.

Yadusky, making his varsity début in Red and Blue togs, held Ursinus to four hits, three of which came in the third inning, when the Collegeville team scored its two runs and tied the score.

After the third inning Yadusky gave

a remarkable exhibition of early season pitching by holding the visitors hitless, not a man reaching first base over the

final six innings' stretch.
Almost-as clever as Yadusky's part of the chilly afternoon entertainment was that of Elwood Cornog, the former Swarthmore College pitcher and brother of Coach Allie Cornog of Ursinus. Only six hits were made off Cornog, although

he got anything but good support.
Two of Penn's runs in the second inning were driven in by Marshall Payn, the former De Witt Clinton High School athlete, who was playing his first varsity game. Two men were out when Payn singled to centre and drove in Sullivan and McMullen. Goldblatt scored the winning run in the third, when he was safe on Canan's error, which was followed by singles by Mouradian and Sullivan and an infield out.

McMullen and Kengle, the rival centre fielders, played brilliantly, the former

snaring five hard chances and the latter

four.
