PHILADELPHIA, April 6.—After the University of Pennsylvania had led Bowdoin up to the eighth inning ch Franklin Field today, the New Englanders staged a rally, scored five runs and defeated the Red and Blue by a score of 6 to 2. The Penn infield became demoralized in the eighth inning and helped the visitors to their triumph.

Flynn, who was knocked out of the box by Princeton yesterday, came back strong and held the Red and Blue to four hits. Earlier in the week he also beat Columbia. Roth of Newark, pitching his first varsity game for Penn, looked fine until Bowdoin started to bunt in the eighth. Then he was relieved by Larsen, the big southpaw, who gave way to a pinch hitter. McDougal finished the game.

Penn's only runs came in the first inning, when Mouradian hit a home run over Centre Fielder Graves's head, scor-ing Payn ahead of him.
