

PENN BEATS GREEN IN 15-INNING TILT

Pitchers Are Heroes of Long Contest Which Ends in a Score of 6 to 5.

PHILADELPHIA, April 8.—After battling for fifteen innings on Franklin Field this afternoon Penn defeated Dartmouth by a score of 6 to 5. A large crowd witnessed the game and tarried until after 6 o'clock to see the finish.

This was the longest battle staged on the West Philadelphia diamond in eleven years, when the Princeton Tigers and Penn staged a seventeen-inning game.

Bill Yadusky, the Shenandoah lad, who is in his second year at Penn, twirled the entire fracas for Coach Dr. Cariss, and, although he was touched up for fourteen hits, he generally kept them well scattered. In three innings only could big Jeff Tesreau's sluggers connect for more than one safety. And as the game went into extra innings Yadusky became better and better, and always tightened up with men on the paths.

This was the second victory of the week for Yadusky, he having defeated the Ursinus combination on Tuesday in a six-inning game.

Slim Lyons, the Dartmouth flinger, also toiled the entire distance and really deserved a better fate. He held the Red and Blue batters to ten hits and only walked one man in the last ten innings. He faltered, however, in the fatal fifteenth, when Whitehill started the fireworks with a long single to centre field. Goldblatt then laid down a pretty bunt which advanced the former Rutgers star to second base. Mike advanced to third on Mouradian's rap to second and then tore home with the winning run when Danny Sullivan, the Cortland, N. Y., boy, banged a single off Shapleigh's legs.
