

PHILLIES TROUNCE

FENN NINE, 17 TO 5

Leslie Leads Big Leaguers' Attack With Home Run, Double and Single.

PHILADELPHIA, April 10. — The Phillies had no trouble in defeating the University of Pennsylvania baseball team this afternoon, 17 to 5.

The collegians got away to a two-run advantage in the opening inning. But the National leaguers got going in the third and with the bases filled, Roy Leslie, the new first baseman of the Phil machine, bounced a homer into the left field bleachers. Thus, at one swipe of the ash, the Phils were out in front, never to be headed again.

Leslie was the big gun in the Phillies' attack. The former New Orleans star turned in a hitting card of .750, getting a double and single in addition to his clean-up wallop, out of four times at bat.
