Whitehill, the Penn first baseman, made a homer in the seventh when Mahaffey was on base. Both of these big blows were made off Mapes who was battered for ten runs and nine hits in seven innings. Highly, who finished for the Hoboken collegians, ran into another Penn outburst in the eighth when the Red and Blue got two runs and three more hits. more hits.

Coach Cariss of Penn called on three pitchers, Huntzinger, Larsen and Roth, and they held the visitors to five hits. Stevens, with the exception of Short-

stop H. O'Callaghan, put up a snappy game. The visiting shortstop made four of his team's five errors, his misplays leading up to a number of Penn runs. Coach Cariss was obliged to use Dwyer, a new man, at second base, as Goldblatt is still out with a bad ankle.
