

TIGERS WIN OVER PENN NINE BY 4-3

Southpaw Thomas, Although Wild In His Delivery, Holds Quakers to Two Hits.

PHILADELPHIA, April 22.—Although the University of Pennsylvania nine played an errorless game here this afternoon, Princeton won by the score of 4 to 3. Failure to think in the pinches cost Penn the game. In the third inning Captain Billy Maher thought two were out instead of one and tried for a force at the plate. This resulted in three Princeton runs trickling across without the aid of anything that looked like a base hit.

Joe Thomas, a lanky, red-headed southpaw, was on the hill for the Jersey-men, and gave Coach Clarke one of the most unpleasant afternoons he has spent as coach of the Orange and Black, and that dates back many years. Thomas was stingy with hits, only two coming from the Penn bats, one a home run by Danny Sullivan in the second.

But with his passes Thomas was as liberal as a sailor on shore leave. He passed seven men, hit another and made two wild pitches, but with it all came through a winner.

Bill Yadusky, the big righthander from Shenandoah, Pa., curved for Penn, and deserved a better fate than his first defeat of the season. He allowed only five hits, three of which were bunched for the winning run in the eighth.
