

YALE DOWNS PENN, ALTHOUGH OUTHIT

Errors and Poor Playing Costly to Quakers, Who Bow to Eli Nine, 8 to 3.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., April 29.—Although the University of Pennsylvania drove Yale's two best pitchers, Ted Chittenden and Fred Peterson, to the showers this afternoon, and outbatted the Elis, Yale managed to pull out an 8 to 3 victory. The slowness of Yadusky, the Quaker twirler, in fielding his position, errors by Left Fielder Mouradian and poor judgment on the bases cost the visitors several runs.

Mike Eddy scintillated as Yale's stellar performer, corralling three long flies and making a sensational assist of Goldblatt's grounder to deep right in the seventh, after Yadusky had singled, checking the Quakers' final batting rally. Joe Oed's all-round game and the double play fielding form exhibited by Captain Aldrich and Dan Kelly were the headlines of the Yale play.

An odd feature of the game occurred in the injection into the game of Tom Durant as base runner for Kernan and Hickey, who were lame, scoring three runs. Durant was not in the game except as substitute base runner, although he scored more runs than any other Yale player and as many as the entire Pennsylvania nine. After Kernan walked in the second, Durant, running for him, scored on Maher's overthrow to second to catch Eddy, who was stealing. Crane scored in the third on Yadusky's fumble, a steal and Captain Aldrich's hit to centre.

McMullen broke the ice for the Quakers in the fourth, walking, taking second on a wild pitch and scoring on Whitehill's single. Two Quakers, Mahaffey and Liebgott, reached first in opening the fifth with none out, but were snuffed by sharp Eli fielding. Hickey opened Yale's half with a single; Kelly hit to Yadusky, who threw to second too slowly. Oed scored Durant, running for Hickey, and Kelley with a single, and reached third on Mouradian's fumble. He stole home on an attempted squeeze play, Maher dropping the pitch at which Aldrich failed to hit.

Pennsylvania put two across in the sixth, when Mouradian was hit, while Hill singled, and Maher's timely drive to right sent both homeward. In Yale's half Eddy's two-bagger over third and Mallory's out on Goldblatt's circus assist scored Eddy. Yale pushed its final cluster of runs across in the seventh on Oed's and Kernan's singles and Mouradian's muff of Eddy's liner, tallying both base runners.

Today's match was Yale's only clash with Pennsylvania this year, and was the first meeting of the season between Yale and an Eastern Big Four team. A high wind prevailed, but the otherwise ideal weather brought out a crowd of about 3,500 people.
