Penn Sluggers Pile Up Eighteen Hits, While Huntzinger and Rohrer Check Invaders.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., May 17 .- Columbia was defeated here today by the University of Pennsylvania nine by a score of 13 to 2. This was Huntzinger's seventh consecutive victory and the second defeat of Columbia by Penn this season.

Huntzinger allowed six hits in five innings and took things easy. He fanned four and was a big figure at the bat with two runs and two hits. Rohrer, who relieved him, did not allow any runs but was in trouble three of the four innings that he worked, the New Yorkers having eight men left in that time.

No Quaker team in years has hit as hard as today. Coach Caris's squad piled up eighteen hits for a total of twenty-five bases off Wunderlich and Price. In the wholesale clouting Danny Sullivan was the master toiler with a home run and three singles in four times at bat. He also lugged three runs home.

Mike Whitehill, Penn's big first baseman, was right on Sullivan's heels with three of the hardest doubles that he has clicked off all season. He also walked once and turned in four runs. Left Fielder Hartman had four of Columbia's ten hits. The score:
