

ARMY BEATEN BY PENN IN THE 14TH

French's Pair of Homers Fail to Save the Soldiers in Final Home Game.

WEST POINT, N. Y., May 24.—The Army closed its home season today, going down to defeat before the University of Pennsylvania by a score of 4 to 3 in fourteen innings. The Cadets earned two of their three tallies, but presented Penn with all four of its runs.

Walter French, baseball, football and basketball hero of the Army, clouted two home runs during the melee. Cragin was taken out at the end of the tenth frame, the coach desiring to save him for the Navy at Annapolis next Monday in the big service battle. The Cadets' diminutive hurler let Penn down with four hits. Huntzinger, too, pitched excellent ball. Penn won the game in the fourteenth. Wilhide's error on Huntzinger's grounder, Goldblatt's sacrifice and Whitehill's drive to left doing the trick.
