## ERSTONE LAID AT FRANKLIN FIELD

## Penn's Ball Team Then Beats Dartmouth, 7-6. Before 3,000 Graduates.

PHILADELPHIA, June 10. - Penn's loyal grads, 3,000 strong, led twelve gray-haired veterans class of 1872, helped lay the cornerstone of the mammoth new Franklin Field stadium today and then cheered Coach Cariss's Red and Blue nine while it took the third straight game this season from Jeff Tesreau's Dartmouth team after a scorching battle, 7 to 6. These were the feature events of Penn's greatest alumni day celebration.

Walt Huntzinger, the Red and Blue's lanky athlete, who is just as proficient on the basketball court as on the baseball diamond, was pitted against Herb Steinhilber, Tesreau's diminutive hurler. Both flingers were reached for some hefty wallops, but the final honors went to the Bellefonte lad, who is winding up a remarkable year on the mound. Today's game was the eleventh for Huntzinger and also his eleventh consecutive victory.

With Mike Whitehill still on the injured list, Coach Cariss had to use a rearranged line-up. Pinney started at first base, but was removed from the line-up in the third frame when Mc-Graw went to bat for him. McMullen then moved in from the outer garden to the first sack , while Mahaffey shifted to centre, with McGraw going to right field.
