

PENN SOCCER ELEVEN DEFEATS HARVARD

Shuts Out Crimson by 3 to 0 in Winning Fourth Straight Game of Season.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 2.—Pennsylvania's varsity soccer team won its fourth straight game of the season today, defeating Harvard at Franklin Field by the score of 3 to 0. The first half saw most of the play in Harvard's territory, with Penn having the advantage in all points of the game.

Bondi, the Harvard goal tender, was kept busy in the first half warding off the ball. Twelve minutes after the game started Linglebach, the former West Philadelphia High star, scored the first goal on a short pass from Amelia, the former dribbling the ball past the two Harvard backs.

The Harvard backs formed the strength of the entire team. The Penn men frequently got through the front line defense easily, only to meet opposition that forced them back.

Ten minutes before the end of the first half Blair took the ball on a pass from Amelia to execute the prettiest shot of the afternoon for a goal from a very difficult angle. Penn scored again in the second half.
