

ARMY HOCKEY TEAM VICTOR OVER PENN

Opens Season by Taking Hard-
Fought Game on Snow-
Covered Rink, 2 to 1.

MARINELLI WINS CONTEST

Scores Deciding Goal In Extra
Period After First Three Ses-
sions End In Tie.

WEST POINT, N. Y., Jan. 6.—The Army opened its hockey season today by defeating the University of Pennsylvania in a hard-fought game, which was played on Stuart Rink. The final score was 2 to 1. The conditions were none too good, the ice, although firm, being covered with snow, owing to a storm which raged throughout and marred the play of both teams.

The contest went into an extra period, the score being tied at 1 to 1 at the conclusion of the third period. It was then agreed that the teams should go on for five minutes of extra play or until a goal had been scored. Marinelli shot the winning goal for the Army after two minutes of the extra period.
