

# PENN DOWNS THE TIGERS.

**Quakers Win First Intercollegiate Wrestling Match, 15 to 10.**

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Jan. 27.—Pennsylvania opened its intercollegiate wrestling season today, with a victory over Princeton on the local mats, 15 to 10. The Red and Blue won five of the seven bouts.

Art Wilson, the Pennsylvania heavy-weight, was the victim of the only mishap when, in a clash with Captain Wilson of the Tigers, the former pulled a tendon in his right arm in an extra period and was obliged to quit the bout. The Tiger captain was thus awarded a fall.

Rabinowitz, the New York lad, won one of Penn's bouts in the 158-pound class when he gained a decision over Robinson of the Orange and Black.
