

# CORNELL RETAINS WRESTLING TITLE

## Penn Victory Over Penn State in Last Bout Gives Cham- pionship to Ithacans.

ITHACA, N. Y., March 24.—Cornell retained the wrestling laurels in an exciting yet long-drawn-out championship meet here today by the margin of one point. The victory of Wilson of Penn over Park of Penn State in the last bout of the match clinched the victory for the Ithacans, and no conquering Cornell athlete ever received from the hands of his supporters a more noisy and spontaneous ovation than the joyous Cornell undergraduates gave to the Penn wrestler. They carried Wilson on their shoulders and they gave him a long Cornell yell as he was leaving the hall. Penn actually won the meet for Cornell.

The final score of this, one of the closest meets in the history of the Intercollegiate Wrestling Association, follows: Cornell 17, Penn State 10, Yale 13, Lehigh 12, Princeton 4, Pennsylvania 2.

It was Cornell's second consecutive victory in two years and the ninth time the teams coached by Walter O'Connell have captured the championship in seventeen intercollegiate meetings.

In the championship matches the hardest bout of the day was the unlimited affair between Captain McKay of Yale and Emery of Princeton. The Yale giant towered over the Princeton entry, but the Tiger was game and put up a great scrap, but lost on time advantage. Emery was perhaps the hardest worked wrestler of the whole meet, competing in six bouts in two days. He was eliminated in the bouts for second place by Captain Wright of Cornell, who, though defeated in the preliminaries yesterday, threw Emery in a little over four minutes today.

Coxe of Lehigh won the shortest victory when he threw Roberts of Yale in about three minutes and a half. The bout for second place between MacWilliams of Cornell and Sherman of Princeton set the record for speed, MacWilliams winning by two seconds over three minutes.

Cornell scored two firsts, two seconds, a third and three falls.
