

# PENN BEATS CORNELL, COMING FROM BEHIND

## Wins See-Saw Contest, 5 to 4, When Allen Singles in the Eighth Inning.

PHILADELPHIA, June 18.—Eddie Allen's timely single to center in the eighth inning gave Penn a victory over Cornell in their annual commencement day battle on Franklin Field this afternoon, the Red and Blue nine winning by 5 to 4. Penn overcame Cornell's early advantage by scoring twice in the fourth and knocking Milligan out of the box in the sixth, when two more tallies were made.

Cornell, however, came back strong in the seventh and tied the score, Penn again going out in front in the eighth and holding the edge to the end.
