## PENN'S WRESTLERS DEFEAT PRINCETON

Take Opening Meet of Season by 19-10, Gaining Two Falls and Three Decisions.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 17.—Penn found Princeton's wrestlers game but inexperienced and had no trouble in defeating them, 19 to 10, in the first meet of the season in Wightman Hall this afternoon. Penn won two falls and gained three time decisions.

Meislan brought the heavyweight event against Schehr to a sudden close when he threw the Penn man with apparent ease after Schehr had piled up more than five minutes time advantage on him. Captain Bill Heister of Penn opened the meet with a fall over Grood of Princeton. He threw his opponent with a double bar lock after five minutes and five seconds. McDonald followed by scoring a fall over Royster, in the 125-pound event, using a bar lock and half nelson.

Lilienfeld, a veteran of last year's team, won time advantage over Franz in the 135-pound class, but Captain Buttrey of Princeton was best in the 145-pound event and made short work of Holland, the Penn man. He used a half-nelson body hold.
