

COLUMBIA MATMEN THROW PENN, 19-8

Falls by Aulick and Molyneux
and Three Decisions Gain
Unexpected Triumph.

SESTIT WINS TIME AWARD

Injured Football Star Outclasses
Herriot—McDonald Registers
Only Fall for Losers.

Columbia's wrestling team pulled the unexpected in the Morningside gymnasium yesterday afternoon by handing a 19 to 8 trouncing to the Pennsylvania matmen. Falls for Captain Aulick in the unlimited weight division and Molyneux in the 145-pound class and three decisions on time advantages and referee's awards gave the Blue and White its margin. The visitors' only points came on a fall for McDonald in the 135-pound bout and a time advantage for Cree in the 158-pound event.

Aulick, the Lion leader, was pitted against Strohm, a 234-pound Quaker sophomore, in the unlimited encounter, but he had no difficulty in disconcerting his ponderous rival and pinned him to the mat in 6 minutes and 14 seconds with a bar and half-nelson after downing him on a previous occasion.

Mike Sedit, star football halfback, made his first appearance of the season on the mat in competition since his injury on the gridiron and proved superior to Herriot, Penn veteran, winning on a time advantage of 3 minutes and 5 seconds.
