

# COLUMBIA WRESTLERS THROW PENN, 14 TO 13

**Boyle, Weighing 160, Defeats  
Strohm, 240, in Final Match  
to Gain Victory.**

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 5. — Columbia's wrestlers shaded the Penn grapplers in the Palestra tonight, 14 to 13. It was the third straight defeat for the Red and Blue.

The victory came as a result of Joe Boyle's victory by one minute and eight seconds time advantage over Strohm in the heavyweight match. The Columbia grappler weighed 160, while his Penn opponent was at 240 pounds. Captain Mike Sesit of Columbia lost a close decision to Tom Pratt in the 175-pound division after an extra period. John Nichols, the Blue and White 115-pounder, lost his first bout since he entered Columbia.

- 175-Pound Class—Thomas Pratt, Penn, defeated Mike Sesit, Columbia, referee's decision in an extra period.
- Heavyweight—Joe Boyle, Columbia, defeated Don Strohm, Penn, time advantage of 1:08.
