

Sanford Fans 8 in 3 Frames In Penn Game Halted by Rain

PHILADELPHIA, April 21.— Captain Foster Sanford Jr. of the Penn baseball team was in a fair way to set up a strike-out record in the game today against Bucknell, when rain stopped play with two out in the fourth inning. Neither team had scored. Sanford had fanned eight men in the first three innings, retiring the side on strikes in the third. Bucknell made only one hit off him. Ed Halicki of Bucknell was also in good form, allowing only four hits.
