

PENN A. C. REPULSES PENN SEXTET, 10 TO 4

Saltstonstall and Walsh, Each
With Four Goals, Lead
Clubmen to Victory.

O'REILLY GETS TWO POINTS

Captain Sets Pace for Collegians,
but Five Goals in Second Period
Give Victors Winning Edge.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 12.—The University of Pennsylvania opened its hockey season tonight by losing to the Penn Athletic Club at the Arena, 10 to 4.

Bill Saltonstall, former Harvard star and captain of the Penn A. C., and Jimmy Walsh, former Georgetown athlete, led the clubmen with four goals each.

The Penn A. C. sextet virtually won its game in the second period when it scored five of its goals. Captain Eddie O'Reilly, Mount Vernon, N. Y., starred for the collegians with two goals, while C. A. Pringle, Dundille, Ont., and A. T. Adams, Long Meadow Mass., each contributed a goal. Frank Legost, Mount Vernon, made his varsity debut at wing.
