**ST. JOHN'S SEXTET

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Dec. 19.—

The University of Pennsylvania defeated St. John's College of Brooklyn at the Arena tonight, 6 to 5, in an overtime hockey game.

With the score deadlocked at 5 goals, James Holland of Brookline, Mass., hit the puck past Goal Tender Doughtney 2 minutes and 47 seconds after the extra period opened.

Holland also scored another goal in the third period. Captain Ed O'Reilly of Mount Vernon, N. Y., also tallied two goals for Penn, while Donigan excelled for St. John's.
