## PARHAM WINS IN FEATURE

Tosses Boyd With a Headlock in  
Heavyweight Match—Victors  
Sweep Lightweight Classes.

WEST POINT, N. Y., Feb. 15. - Army wrestlers won from the University of Pennsylvania team today, 21 to 11. Five bouts went to the cadets out of the eight contested.

There were several falls, Army getting three and Penn one.

The lightweight classes all went to Army. Penn came back strongly beginning with the 155-pound class, where Fapano took a decision over Packard, Army team captain. Parham tossed Boyd with a head lock in a feature bout, the heavyweight affair.

- 115 Pounds—Momm, Army, defeated Heugh by time advantage of 3:22.
- 125 Pounds—Adams, Army, threw Vroom with a head and leg hold after 7:28.
- 135 Pounds—Fisher, Army, threw Horn with a cradle hold after 1:48.
- 145 Pounds—Smellow, Army, defeated Brubaker, time advantage of 4:05.
- 155 Pounds—Papano, Penn, defeated Packard with time advantage of 1:51.
- 165 Pounds—Lee, Penn, defeated Jamison, time advantage of 1:50.
- 175 Pounds—Gabriel, Penn, threw Hillsinger with a double arm lock after 6:59.
- Heavyweight—Parham, Army, threw Boyd with a headlock after 4:33.
