

# YALE SOCCER TEAM BEATS HARVARD, 1-0

Victors Gain Tie for First Place  
With Crimson and Penn in  
Intercollegiate Race.

## PENN CONQUERS PRINCETON

Triumphs by Score of 4-0—Lehigh  
Downs Lafayette, 3-0—Other  
College Games.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Nov. 22.—By defeating Harvard, 1 to 0, before a crowd of 6,000, Yale today tied the Crimson and Pennsylvania in the intercollegiate soccer football race. Today's defeat was the first for Harvard, while Yale has been beaten only by Pennsylvania, which Harvard defeated. Yale will close its season Thanksgiving Day with the Navy at Annapolis.

Knudsen, Yale's outstanding star, scored the only goal in today's game early in the third period after taking a pass from his team-mate, Freeman. Harvard slightly outplayed Yale in the first half, but Yale assumed the aggressive in the second, and only the brilliant defense of the Harvard goalie, Catenelli, repeatedly averted disaster.
