

INDIANA DEFEATS PENN WRESTLERS

Hoosiers Win Six Out of Eight
Matches at Philadelphia
to Score by 24-10.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 17.—Indiana University handed Pennsylvania its second wrestling defeat of the season today by beating the Red and Blue at the Palestra, 24 to 10.

Six of the eight matches were won by the Hoosiers, three by falls. Abe Mann, star sophomore, who last week was the only one to gain a victory in the meet with Columbia, threw George Belshaw in the 165-pound class to gain Penn's 5 earned points.

The other points were picked up by Stan Sokolis, football tackle, when Rascher could not continue in the heavyweight class on account of an old injury.
